Spending that time with my family was not only a lot of fun, but has also stayed with me for many years.

So as we go into this summer with all the craziness of sports, and camps, and work; take some time to have close family time. Even when your teenage son or daughter can't stand it, and you would think that you were killing them, make them go! It is important and will stick with them for their lifetime. My prayer for you this summer is for your family to develop something that will bring back that wonderful family feeling for your children fifteen to twenty years down the road. For me it is sitting back on a boat, pole in hand, and listening to the Royals maybe win a game. I hope you and your family find your "it".

The Pius X Trap Club is a member of the Eastern Cornhusker Trapshooting Conference which has over 1,000 junior high and senior high students registered. Pius X High School has fielded a team since the beginning of the trapshooting program in 1972. Due to the increasing number of shooters over the past 10 years, the conference has been divided several times and currently has north, central and south divisions. Pius X is a member of the Central Division where trap meets are held at Lincoln Trap and Skeet, Ashland Izaak Walton League and Lincoln Izaak Walton League. A total of six conference meets are held each year. The annual National High School Cornhusker Trap Shoot is held the first week of May in Doniphan, Nebraska, and has attracted over 1,700 participants in recent years.

The Pius X Trap Club had an excellent season. The Pius #1 Team which consisted of Travis O'Connell, Travis Agee, Matt Sullivan, Zach Borzekofski, Ryan Lafler (4 meets) and John Liescheski (2 meets) competed in 6 conference meets. Team awards are presented to the top three teams in the 16 yard, handicap and overall events. Out of a possible 18 team awards, they won a total of 15 team awards. In the 16 yard event they won three- 1st place and two- 2nd place; in the handicap event they received one- 1st place, two- 2nd place and one- 3rd place; and in the overall event they placed 1st- three times, 2nd- one time and 3rd- two times. Shooters who won individual awards included: Ryan Lafler (1), Craig Siekman (1), Brett Wiebeck (2), Zach Borzekofski (2), Matt Sullivan (3), Travis Agee (4) and Travis O'Connell (5).

The Eastern Cornhusker Trapshooting Conference recognizes members for both shooting and academics. Academic awards were presented to: Erin Drozda, Jeff Slattery and Ryan Slattery. Conference shooting awards were presented to: Matt Sullivan (Senior Male 3<sup>rd</sup> Team – Central Division – 83.4), Zach Borzekofski (Senior Male 2<sup>nd</sup> Team – Central Division – 83.8), Travis Agee (Senior Male 1<sup>st</sup> Team – Central Division – 85.6) and Travis O'Connell (Senior Male 3<sup>rd</sup> Team – All Conference – 86.6).

The Pius X Trap Club participated in the National High School Cornhusker Trapshoot State Tournament. A total of 1,216 shooters competed over the two-day shoot. Travis O'Connell became the first Pius X shooter to win a championship when he took 1st in the 16-yard event by shooting 100 out of 100 and winning a shoot-off against three others by breaking all 10 targets despite shooting with high winds along with snow and sleet. Travis Agee shot a 98 and was also in a shoot-off against 13 other shooters for just three medals. Unfortunately, he missed one target and was eliminated. ### Presidential Scholars Program

Jim Morin, a graduating senior at Pius X High School, has been named one of approximately 560 semifinalists in the 2008 Presidential Scholars Program. The semifinalists were selected from more than 3,000 candidates on the basis of superior achievements, leadership qualities, personal character, and involvement in community and school activities.



Final selection of the Scholars will be made by the Commission on Presidential Scholars, a group of eminent citizens appointed by the President, and will be announced in May 2008. The Commission will select one young man and one young woman from each state, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and U.S. students living abroad; up to 20 students representing the visual, literary and performing arts; and 15 students at-large.

Scholars will be invited to Washington D.C., for several days in the second half of June to receive the Presidential Scholars medallion at a recognition ceremony and to participate in various activities and events held in their honor.

The 513 semifinalists in the program's academic component were initially selected as candidates for their exceptional performance on either the College Board SAT or the ACT Assessment. For the arts component of the program, 60 additional semifinalists were nominated by the National Foundation for Advancement of the Arts, which annually conducts a competitive, national talent search of over 6,500 young artists in a wide range of disciplines.

Semifinalists were chosen by a panel of distinguished educators after a review of students' essays, self-assessments, descriptions of activities, school recommendations, and school transcripts.

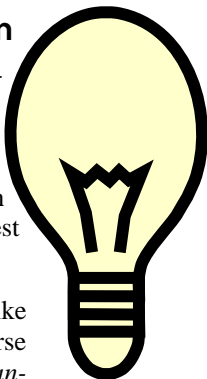

Father Meysenburg said he expects approximately 60 boys and girls to be part of next year's team. Until now, only the six public schools had swimming teams in Lincoln.

The Pius X Booster Club pledged its support to the new swimming and diving teams, and will continue to back the athletic teams, vocal and instrumental music groups, cheerleading, speech and drama clubs and other student activities at Pius X. ### Dress Requirements For 2008-09 Yearbook



**All** students, grades **9-12**, must be dressed following these guidelines for the **2008-09 class pictures** sections of the Thunderer Yearbook:

**Girls:** Tops or dresses that reach the neckline with no obvious cleavage and cover the shoulders; no words or symbols on clothing. Pictures with facial or body piercing, tattoos or hats are not acceptable.

**Boys:** Suits or sport coats with long neckties or bowties; sport shirt (polo shirts) with top button open; turtlenecks, v-neck sweaters with shirts or crew neck sweaters or shirts. No words or symbols on clothing. Pictures with facial hair, any piercing, tattoos or hats are not acceptable.

### Senior Photograph Submission Policy

#### Specifications:

- 1). **Size and Shape:** A vertical print, of approximately 2" X 3", or a standard wallet size is required.
- 2). **Background:** The background may be indoor or outdoor but should be simple and devoid of any writing or symbols that may detract from the student's face.
- 3). **Tone:** Faces must stand out from the background and have sufficient contrast to avoid a flat, faint, or shallow appearance.
- 4). **Poses:** Students shall be conservatively posed, preferably full front or slightly to the side. Avoid extreme angles, profile views, or gazing into space.
- 5). **Clothing:** Please review the dress requirements listed above, and follow them closely. Your photo will not be included if these requirements are not met.



#### Procedures:

- 1). **Deadline:** The deadline for Yearbook/Senior Video photo submission will be **Tuesday, November 25, 2008**.
- 2). **Schedule Photos Early:** Seniors are urged to have their pictures taken during the summer and early fall months to allow enough time to meet this deadline.
- 3). **Follow The Requirements:** If an acceptable photo is not submitted by the deadline, the Pius X Yearbook Advisor will review the photo taken by the school photo company for ID purposes and use it instead.
