From The Guidance Office Director - Jan Frayser

This is the last newsletter before summer begins, so I want to "spend my space" with suggestions from Lincoln Police Chief Tom Casady. They were first printed in the *Journal Star* in November of 2006 with the title, "Top Cop's Tips to Parents." May they help you and your teen(s).

* **Clear Expectations** - Make it absolutely clear to your kids what you believe and what you expect. Don't assume that they know where you stand. Most kids are bonded with their parents, and they don't want to disappoint them. If they know you feel strongly about premarital sex, underage drinking or illicit drug use, they are less likely to engage in these behaviors. Mom and Dad give them a strong reason to resist temptation.

* **Curfews** - All teenagers need a hard and fast curfew until they have reached the age of 19 or have graduated from high school. I suggest 10 p.m. on school nights and midnight on other nights as the latest regular curfew. Exceptions for older kids on special occasions should be just that - exceptions specifically approved by a parent in advance on a rare event such as a chaperoned post-prom party.

* **Unstructured Time** - With teenagers, it pays to minimize the quantity of purely unstructured time during the week. Teens need schedules. Time for homework, family time, part-time work, volunteer hours, household chores, sports and other extracurricular activities all provide structure to the week and reduce the amount of unstructured time. Avoid a situation in which the major out-of-school activity is "hanging out" or "cruising." I know it's hard to stay up past the weather forecast, but I urge you to check out O Street at 1 a.m. on a warmish Friday or Saturday (that would actually be Saturday or Sunday) and see what you think.

* **It's Three O'Clock: Do You Know Where Your Kids Are?** - It is vital to know where your kids are, what they are doing, and who they are with. You should know the full names of friends, where they live, when to expect your teens home and exactly where they are going and what they are doing. There is nothing wrong with checking up on your kids now and then. Keep in mind that this is not just a nighttime issue. Many problematic behaviors are happening right after school - before parents are home from work.

* **Sleepovers** - Overnight stays with friends should not be a weekly occurrence, and something is a bit amiss when high school aged kids want to spend Friday and Saturday night somewhere else. Think about it: wasn't it about 7th grade or so when this was no longer cool? We frequently encounter kids out and about who have lied about staying with a friend, or host parents who are unaware that another teen is supposedly spending the night. The favorite place to stay is often the home with heavy sleeping parents and a ground-level escape hatch. Never let your teen stay with a friend unless you know the parent and have discussed it in advance with the parent. Remember that you are entrusting someone else to provide a suitable environment for your teen.

* **Camping** - Camping is a great activity for teens, but you might be suspicious when your teenager who claims to have an allergic reaction to mowing the lawn suddenly wants to commune with nature on Friday night by going camping with friends. More than s'mores are being consumed by the campfire. We often encounter underage drinking or other high-risk behavior at area campgrounds and lakes. I heartily recommend camping, but I also suggest parental participation.

* **Party Time** - Police officers encounter alcohol at teen parties regularly. Talk to your kids about this, and I think they will tell you that it is common for someone to be drinking at parties. Don't let your kids go to parties at private residences unless you have personally spoken to the parents who are hosting the event, and unless you trust them to ensure that the event is alcohol free and that they will be paying attention to what's going on downstairs. Stay up until your teen comes home, and use your nose.

* **Motel and Hotels** - Don't even think about renting a motel room for your teen, or allowing your teen to attend a gathering at someone else's motel room. Although motels have generally clamped down on teen rentals due to damage and complaints, it still happens with some regularity. This is particularly true on prom nights and during state basketball, volleyball and wrestling tournaments.

* **Home Alone** - I don't think it's a good idea to let high school-aged youth stay at home alone while parents are out of town - even overnight. We often encounter teen drinking parties at homes where the parents are gone. I know you don't think your teen would do such a thing, but the temptation is great. There are going to be three tough years when your teen is too old for a babysitter and too young to stay at home alone. This is when grandparents and best friends can help. Just remember to return the favor when the shoe's on the other foot.

* **Private Matters** - The fourth amendment does not apply to parents. Too many parents are ignoring dangerous behavior right under their nose - guns, drugs, gang paraphernalia, alcohol, cigarettes. If the police are finding these kinds of things in bedrooms and automobiles, you have to wonder why parents aren't. You are free to look around in your teen's room, car, drawers, closet, books, backpacks, under the bed, above the ceiling tiles, inside the ductwork, under the spare tire, in the ashtray, glove box, trunk, etc. An obsessive concern with adults looking around is a major warning sign.

* **You Aren't That Mean** - All teenagers of all generations try to convince their parents that every other parent lets their kids _____ (fill in the blank). You tried this on your parents, didn't you? Don't fall for it. Everyone else's parents feel pretty much the same way you do. Doubt it? Call them and ask. What you will discover is this: That despite the kids' claims to the contrary, nobody's parents are comfortable with the idea of six teenagers loading into a car and driving to a concert in Kansas City. As soon as one parent expresses this feeling to another, the game is over.

* **"You Don't Trust Me"** - This is the neutron bomb of parent-teen relations, usually deployed when you are expressing some discomfort with a scheme suggested by your teen, and normally preceding the "you-are-so-mean" approach. Don't feel guilty. There's a pretty fine line between trusting and being gullible. Here's my favorite response: "I trust you. But I love you even more, and I don't want you to worry that I'll be worried."

By necessity, these suggestions paint with a broad brush. Obviously there are exceptions, and there are exceptional kids. If it helps to get the job done, please feel free to blame me for your hopelessly old-fashioned and out-of-touch rules. May your summer be filled with faith, family, joy, love and relaxation. A delightful novel for the lazy days of summer that I hope you have is Bill Bryson's, *A Walk in the Woods*.

Lenten Services Conducted By The Pius X J. Walkers

The J. Walkers created and prepared six weekly Lenten services for Pius X students and staff. The overall theme for Lent this year was "The Sorrowful Mysteries". Each week we prayed a decade of the rosary in various languages and had a few speakers and reflections. During the final service we reflected on fasting.

The first week we watched a video to the song, "Jesus in the Garden" by Michael Card. After that, Katie Hoppe led us in praying the first Sorrowful Mystery, the Agony in the Garden. Fr. Holdren shared with us a reflection on this mystery and concluded the service with a blessing.

During the second service, we focused on the second Sorrowful Mystery, the Scourging at the Pillar. The fruit of this mystery is purity so Fr. Kubat shared with us his experience of modesty as he works with inmates and their families at the prison. After this, Meghan Moser, Melanie Stara, Laura Foley, and Katie Ellerbee led us in praying a decade of the rosary in Spanish.

The third Sorrowful Mystery, the Crowning of Thorns, was the focus of our third service. Sierra Weber, a junior, shared with us her personal story of some of the pain she has endured and how her faith carried her through this very difficult time. We concluded the service by praying a decade of the rosary in French, led by Katie Holden, Norma Volkmer, Anna Henrichsen & Katy Keiter.

We worked with Club World Aid, sponsored by Mrs. Margaret Kaiser-Woodward, for our fourth Lenten service. Caitlin Hassler opened our service with a prayer and introduction to a documentary about Sudanese refugees that live in Lincoln. It was a powerful documentary, especially since it was made by a Lincoln High student who interviewed her fellow classmates. We concluded our service by praying the fourth Sorrowful Mystery, the Carrying of the Cross. This was prayed in Vietnamese and was lead by Victoria Tran, Liz Nguyen and Mai Nguyen.

Our fifth Lenten service included a reflection by senior Daniel Blake on the power of love and the fifth Sorrowful Mystery, the Crucifixion. Mr. Tom Korta led us in praying a decade of the rosary in Latin.

The final Lenten service included prayers, a scripture reading, reflection and a couple songs. Alec Sasse, Sawyer Kreikemeier, Hunter Creglow, Tanner Lockhorn, Anissa Milburn, Keevan Statz, Nick Demery, and Mairead Safranek all helped in leading prayers and reflections and the choir, led by Mrs. Mary Odgaard sang, "Written in Red."

FCT Visits Madonna Residents And Raises Money For Haiti

Each Lenten season, the Pius X Fellowship of Christian Teens (FCT) group takes on a service project in order to volunteer as a group. On February 18, 2010, twenty students spent an hour with residents at Madonna Rehabilitation Hospital. After their visit, each student composed a story about the life of the resident they visited. The residents were VERY excited to receive these great stories! The students are making plans to go back and visit their resident.

STARS Mentors

Setting boundaries and sticking to them was the topic of the last STARS meeting in April. A glass jar of clear water was used to represent purity in a dating relationship. Food coloring then changed the water to yellow, then red to demonstrate how a relationship changes the more physical it becomes. Blue coloring was added to the water to demonstrate how a relationship becomes clouded once it becomes sexual. To show how there is no going back in a relationship at this point, more clear water was added but the water still stayed dark and cloudy. The importance of boundaries was discussed along with talking about all the many ways a couple can be intimate without engaging in sexual activity, such as going for a walk, talking on the phone, cooking a meal together, writing each other a letter, riding bikes, etc. The meeting ended with talking about how one can protect his/her boundaries with refusal skills. The STARS Mentors met with 7th graders on April 23rd for a lesson on the character pillar of TRUST. The mentors demonstrated how messages get distorted when passed on from person to person with a pantomime skit. Texting and bullying were tied into the discussion. Frey Named Academic All-American



Andrea Frey competed with the Nebraska Red Dawgs in the National Wheelchair Basketball Tournament in Denver, Colorado, in April 2010. The Nebraska Red Dawgs finished 5th in the Junior Division-Varsity Level. At this national tournament, the Red Dawgs defeated teams from Seattle, San Diego, and Houston. Their only loss was to National Runner-Up, Rancho Renegades, from Los Angeles. In March, the Red Dawgs finished 2nd in the Northern Conference Tournament losing to the three-time National Champion, Minnesota Timberwolves.

After careful consideration of all the nominations, grade transcripts and essays, The Northern Conference All-Academic Team Selection Committee named 14 members to the team including Andrea who holds a 3.98 GPA. Andrea was the captain of the Junior Division-Varsity Level Northern Conference All-Academic Team. Andrea was also named Academic All-American. New Artificial Turf Project For Aldrich Field



Pius X High School announces that they will soon be replacing the sod on Aldrich Field with new artificial turf. The \$500,000 project is scheduled to begin toward the end of May, 2010, with a completion deadline of August 1, 2010.

An anonymous donor came forward and provided a lead challenge gift for the specific purpose of equipping Aldrich Field with turf. We recognize that there are other facility priorities including the kitchen for which much of the BOLT dinner auction dollars are designated, and that the Tradition of Faith Campaign and other diocesan campaigns are ongoing or in the initial stages. However, this opportunity could not be overlooked. Pius X representatives and the anonymous donor asked a few others for help in this challenge project. Several of those approached have taken interest and invested in the project. \$440,000 has been raised to date. We are very thankful for the lead and supporting gifts.

“There has been incredible support from the handful of individuals involved with this project,” said Michelle Birkel, Development Director. “We have many alumni, parents and friends who regularly support Lincoln’s only Catholic high school with gifts of various sizes. We continue to be pleased and amazed that so many people are willing to help. This investment will benefit our students and families for decades.”

The artificial turf will provide many benefits including the reduction of impact injuries as athletes will play on a safer and more uniform surface. Aldrich Field will now be multi-purpose allowing band, soccer, football and track to perform on the new playing surface. Maintenance costs will also be reduced as watering, mowing, fertilizers and pesticides will no longer be required. The only maintenance requirement will be raking the field a few times a year. Furthermore, the practice facilities behind the school will be less torn up providing opportunities for the soccer teams to practice on site and not having to travel off site for practice.

This project will have a huge impact on Pius X,” said Tim Aylward, Athletic Director. “Not only will it provide a tremendous venue for our teams, band and students to play and practice on, but it will show that we continue to care about our students and the quality of the facilities at our school.”

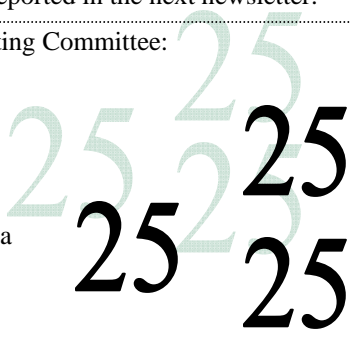
lottery tickets, bid run, valet park and help with clean up as well as singing at our Mass before BOLT. We also have tremendous support from all the Pius X High School staff.

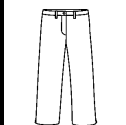

2010-2011 Physical Examination Form

All athletes participating in any sport during the 2010-2011 school year must have a physical that is dated after May 1, 2010, in order to try out for a team. The NSAA requires a three-part NSAA Pre-Participation Physical Form that includes: (1) a **History Form**; (2) the actual **Physical Examination Form**; and (3) the **Clearance Form**. To meet privacy and HIPAA requirements, the examining physician will retain on file the History Form and the Physical Examination Form, with only the **Clearance Form** being returned to the student to be placed on file at the school. 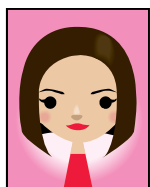
Dress Requirements For 2010-11 Yearbook & I.D.



All students, **grades 9-12**, must be dressed following these guidelines for the **2010-11 class pictures** sections of the Thunderer Yearbook and I.D.:

Girls: Tops or dresses that reach the neckline with no obvious cleavage and cover the shoulders; no words or symbols on clothing including Pius X or Husker symbols. Pictures with facial or body piercing, tattoos, or hats are not acceptable.

Boys: Suits or sport coats with long neckties or bowties; sport shirt (polo shirts) with top button open; turtle-necks, v-neck sweaters with shirts, crew neck sweaters, or shirts. No words or symbols on clothing including Pius X or Husker symbols. Pictures with facial hair, any piercing, tattoos, or hats are not acceptable.



Senior Photograph Submission Policy

Specifications:

1. **Size & Shape:** A professional .jpeg image, vertical print of approximately 2" X 3", or a standard wallet size is required.
2. **Background:** The background may be indoor or outdoor but should be simple and devoid of any writing or symbols that may detract from the student's face.
3. **Tone:** Faces must stand out from the background and have sufficient contrast to avoid a flat, faint, or shallow appearance.
4. **Poses:** All photos must be head/shoulder shots only. Students shall be conservatively posed, preferably full front or slightly to the side. Avoid extreme angles, profile views, or gazing into space.
5. **Clothing:** Please review the dress requirements listed above [Dress Requirements For 2010-11 Yearbook & I.D.], and follow them closely. Your photo will not be included if these requirements are not met.

Procedures:

1. **Deadline:** The deadline for yearbook/senior photo submission will be **Friday, November 12, 2010, at 4:00 p.m.**
2. **Schedule Photos Early:** Seniors are urged to have their pictures taken during the summer and early fall months to allow enough time to meet this deadline. Photographers often take months to return the photos.
3. **Follow The Requirements:** If an acceptable photo is not submitted by the deadline, the Pius X Yearbook Advisor will review the photo taken by the school photo company for ID purposes and use it instead. If a photo was not taken or is inappropriate, the student will not be pictured in the senior mugs pages.

Note: If you want the yearbook staff to take your photos, we are thrilled to practice on our seniors. Schedule an appointment with Mrs. Sullivan in the fall and bring a change of clothing with you.

Photographer Submission:

Your photographer may submit photos to us in .jpeg form. Please ask them to do so well ahead of the deadline to help us account for students who are unable to afford to have their pictures taken and help them.

Wallet-Size Hard-Copy Submission:

These are 2 very simple "tools" to help you and your student to stay on top of things. Too many parents (and students) wait until it's too late to check on things.

PLEASE check these often! Come the end of the school year, you'll either be glad you did or wishing you had.

SCIP News- Parents Do Matter

Three-quarters of kids up to age 17 say parents influence their drinking decisions and they turn to them for guidance. So, speak often with your child about alcohol:

- ◆ Explain why alcohol, as a sedative drug, is dangerous.
- ◆ Talk about how alcohol can harm a teen's growing brain.
- ◆ Emphasize that underage drinking is illegal. Make it clear that you want your teen to respect the law and be safe, so you expect him/her not to drink.
- ◆ Find out where your child is going and with whom. Agree on a time they need to be home and explain the consequences if they drink.
- ◆ Help your teen brainstorm useful strategies for resisting pressure to drink.
- ◆ Show respect and caring. Listen respectfully to his/her ideas and concerns.

The University of Nebraska Lincoln has informed Pius X High School- **“they will no longer accept any forwarded ACT/SAT scores from high schools for the fall/summer 2011 term.”** The only ACT scores they will accept will have to be sent to them directly from the ACT testing company. There are two ways to accomplish this: 1) include the ACT/SAT code number for UNL on the ACT/SAT registration form and the score will be sent directly to UNL. 2) If you do not include the number on the registration form you will need to request the scores from ACT/SAT with an Additional Score Report Request form which is available in the Guidance Office. **There is an additional fee for this request score form.**

Students Attending UNL In The Fall

UNL has changed the Math Placement Exam process. It is no longer sent to the high schools. Once you are admitted, you will receive information on how to take the Math Placement Exam on-line.

Job Shadowing

Students: Is your student interested in a career but not quite sure what the job entails? Please provide a copy of any notification letters, certificates of awards or scholarships that you receive from any college or organization to the Guidance Office for verification. We will need this information so we can publish all scholarships in the program for the graduation ceremonies.

NCAA Eligibility Certification

High School student-athletes planning to enroll at an NCAA Division I or II institution in the fall of 2010 should currently be registered with the NCAA Eligibility Center and have completed the amateurism questionnaire. These student-athletes must also have provided official transcripts from all schools attended through grade 11 and have provided official test scores from the testing agency. Only official transcripts sent via U.S. mail or overnight delivery from the high school or district office will be accepted. Electronic transcripts from ConnectEdu, Docufide, e-Scrip Safe, National Transcript Center, and XAP will also be accepted. Copies which have been e-mailed or faxed will not be accepted. If your student-athlete has received a fee waiver for the SAT or ACT, due to his or her inability to pay, he or she also qualifies to have the NCAA Eligibility Center registration fee waived. ACT/SAT Dates

Juniors and Seniors are encouraged to take the ACT and/or SAT. Juniors planning to attend college should consider beginning the testing process sometime during their Junior year. For most students, there is no need to take both tests. Most students do better on the ACT. The ACT has an optional essay; the SAT has a mandatory essay. Students may obtain an application in the Pius X Guidance Office, or may apply online at www.actstudent.org (ACT) or www.collegeboard.com (SAT). The Pius X High School code number is **281-315**.

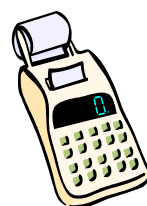

Caffeine As A Supplement

Caffeine is one of the most widely used drugs in the world. In some supplements, it is listed as guarana or kola nut. It can be found in coffee, tea, chocolate, soft drinks, some pain relievers such as Excedrin, some cold medicines, and many weight loss pills. It is sometimes used as a nervous system stimulant to offset fatigue. In the 1990's it was thought to benefit the endurance of athletes by helping release fat stores into the bloodstream. Unfortunately, more fat in the blood does not translate into more fat utilization by muscle.

Studies have shown that caffeine alone or combined with ephedra increases performance by delaying fatigue or increasing the time it takes to reach exhaustion in endurance exercise. Increases in performance have been shown after consuming doses of 3-9 mg/kg of body weight. People who consume it on a daily basis can become adapted and may have to use more caffeine to get the same effect. Caffeine has some side effects. People who do not regularly consume it can experience gastrointestinal distress, nervousness, rapid heart rate, headaches, and increased blood pressure. Caffeine can also have a diuretic effect, but this is usually most pronounced during rest and does not appear to have as large an effect during exercise.
